

Closing with Spiritual Reflection from our Spirital Director, Penny Brinkley

I don't know about you but I really can't believe that 1/6th of the year has already whizzed past. I remember how at the end of lockdown, I said I am not going to get as busy and fill my diary up like I did before. A really good intention but sadly not one I've managed to abide by, but one I know I should at least try to. With that in mind I decided to enroll for a five day art journalling course on line, that I would have access to for always, so often they are only available for a limited time span and if you don't have time well you've wasted your money. I'd got really into Prayer and Bible journalling during lockdown but sadly hadn't done anything recently due to being too busy.

Now, as it happened, the week arrived for the course and it coincided with me being ill, so I had plenty of time to watch and play. It was so relaxing doing just half to an hour each day, I actually found myself relaxing and not worrying about other things, so when I saw another course on Prayer journalling I just had to sign up to that, and again it was one that you could keep for ever.

I have sent some photo's with this article. The two that are just paintings are from the first course and the ones with collage are from the second one.

So why am I telling you all about this? Well, since the courses I have signed up to a year long course with the first tutor, which also gives me access to all her previous lessons, so plenty to keep me going. But most importantly I am trying to take ½ hour everyday to make art. Now I know I have to be realistic and know that some days that just isn't going to happen, but on others I can do a bit more. I don't have to finish things in one sitting. Actually this helps sometimes, especially with the prayer journalling, because you go away and allow time for what you have been praying and doing to soak in God's presence and allow time for Him to speak to you. I realise that taking that ½ hour a day has resulted in my being more relaxed and sleeping better, actually enabling me to accomplish more as I'm less tired. And of course I'm spending some quality time with God allowing Him to feed me, not just looking at His word to see what I can give to others.

I pray that I will be able to keep this up, it's been about a month now and I am learning new skills and rekindling a love of art and refreshing my relationship with God. Now I'm not suggesting you should all take up art, but I would suggest that you all find something that you love that you can do for just ½ hr a day which helps you to engage with God in a meaning full way. A way that helps you to listen to Him speak to you, refresh you and help you get through your busy days.

I look forward to hearing what some of you will find that feeds you like the journalling does me as we meet up over the next few months
